The Royal College of Music, one of the world's great conservatoires, provides music education and professional training at the highest international level. We are committed to music's transformative power and our founding principles of excellence, advocacy, and access. RCM is a global leader in developing versatile, innovative and influential creators, communicators and curators. We embrace the ideals of an inclusive, open and just society, supporting students from diverse social, economic and ethnic backgrounds and we fulfill our obligation to promote the future of music as an agent for meaningful cultural change.



Our list of alumni is essentially a Who's Who of musical excellence. But we do not rest on our laurels. During the last decade, the Royal College has undertaken an unprecedented programme of transformation. The central iconic Blomfield building, our Amaryllis Fleming Concert Hall, Britten Theatre, studios, library, and RCM Museum and Collections all inspire our students and the wider public. The estate's recent expansion has almost doubled the RCM footprint, including a new performance hall, performance studio museum, and café. We have also acquired the former site of English National Ballet near the Royal Albert Hall, incorporating the original RCM Concert Hall, visited by Dvořák and Tchaikovsky in the 1890s.

Located in South Kensington, London, the Royal College of Music offers undergraduate, masters and doctoral level degrees in music performance, vocal performance, composition, performance science and music education.

Many are principal players with London's foremost orchestras, contributing to an innovative artistic programme that offers supreme richness experiences. We have learned much from the online environment imposed by the pandemic as we look forward to an even more thriving future of global reach and global leadership.

We deliver a curriculum within a research culture that seeks to prove our value way beyond music, focusing upon health and well-being, education and creativity. The Centre for Performance Science works with a cross-section of society and has earned a global reputation.

Furthermore, our Creative Careers
Centre offers students countless
prestigious opportunities to perform
and share music with the broader
community. Higher Education Statistics
Agency reports consistently show that
RCM graduates are in high demand.
In the most recent survey, 100% of
respondents moved into employment
or further study within six months
of graduation.

WITH YOUR HELP, WE WILL PROVIDE ENHANCED ACCESS

Recognising our responsibility to be a relevant, persuasive advocate for music in the UK and beyond, we pursue access and engagement locally, nationally, and internationally. Our online resources are open to a global audience and expand the RCM community across all age groups. We also provide a range of ways for the musically gifted and enthusiastic of all ages to engage with an inspirational learning experience.

We also support the most talented students, whatever their financial means, through scholarships, bursaries and hardship funding. Our scholarship programme is benchmarked globally with an ambitious forward strategy.

WE SEEK INSPIRED PHILANTHROPIC INVESTMENT FOR CORE ACTIVITIES TO PROVIDE THE HIGHEST QUALITY MUSIC EDUCATION

Income streams from ticket sales, venue hire, and student accommodation are crucial to delivering our students' education experience. Still, because of Covid-19, we have lost this income, which totals circa £3 million. Tuition fees and the government funding we receive are insufficient to cover the cost of excellence in music education, including one to one teaching and the rich performance programme.

We will make savings without compromising the student experience, including deferring capital investments and strictly limiting all discretionary spending. However, these savings cannot fully compensate for lost income. We forecast that next year will be even more challenging, particularly with a reduction in government funding on the horizon. We need a philanthropic investment of £8 million over the next three years to ensure we provide the highest quality music education, in addition to the funds we regularly raise for student scholarship support.

The Royal College of Music provides a high return on investment (ROI) on donated income. A 2019 Institute of Fundraising benchmark found that the voluntary sector's average ROI is £3.37 per pound invested. Interestingly, our 3-year rolling ROI, which reflects our relationship-based fundraising, is £5.23 per pound invested.
