Students at the RCM enjoy tuition from the very best professors in the world. They are encouraged to broaden their horizons and perform at the highest international level, as well as participate in outreach work through RCM Sparks. They also have access to personalised career guidance and networking through our Creative Careers Centre. Each student tailors their degree to suit their individual interests and aspirations. We pride ourselves on being a creative community where talented individuals excited by the study and practice of music can flourish.

The RCM has trained some of the most important figures in music, including Sir Thomas Allen, Dame Sarah Connolly, Gustav Holst and Ralph Vaughan Williams. The incredible talent of our students and graduates is demonstrated through their predominance in the top spots of national and international competitions, including BBC Young Musician of the Year, Hong Kong International Piano Competition and The Royal Over-Seas League. Our graduates are leading successful careers across the globe in a range of professions from conducting major orchestras to pioneering new education initiatives. Scholarships ensure that all students can reach their full potential.

Music tuition is expensive because of the specialised one-to-one teaching model. The rising costs of higher education and living in London make a conservatoire education out of reach for many young musicians. HOW CAN I HELP?

RCM scholarships are made possible by generous philanthropic support. When you support an annual scholarship, you are providing timely financial assistance to exceptionally talented and deserving young musicians.

ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS

When you establish an endowed scholarship with a gift of £300,000 or more, you are creating a scholarship that will be awarded in perpetuity. Each year, the accrued interest on your gift will support your scholarship, whilst the capital is protected to ensure that your endowment can continue to provide for future generations of inspirational young musicians. An endowed gift creates a stable foundation for planning and future growth, making it uniquely impactful.

An RCM scholarship typically support students' tuition fees, however, undergraduates can opt to use their scholarship funding to support their living costs if, for example, they have already secured a loan to cover their fees. To align with our belief that the opportunity to study at the RCM should be based on artistic talent and dedication, all students offered a place are considered for a scholarship, which are awarded by a committee comprising Heads of Faculties and the RCM Director, on the basis of excellence and need.
